Contents	<p>Lecturer Tyler Lynch Owner of Nagano's Kamesei Ryokan Tyler has taken over managing a traditional Japanese hot spring inn (ryokan) in central Nagano Prefecture, and struggles daily to enliven the inn while taking care of his guests. He will talk about hospitality at the ryokan in a post-Covid world and his efforts to improve the area's attractiveness. «Bio» Tyler is from Seattle, USA and a graduate of the University of Washington, first coming to Japan to study abroad in Kobe during his college years. He taught English in Nagano for 1.5 years, where he came to know the daughter of Kamesei Ryokan's owner, his current wife. After being married in Seattle, he worked in trade for 11 years. After his mother-in-law retired from the ryokan due to old age, Tyler and his wife moved from Seattle back to Japan, and took over the family business in October 2005. He was awarded the second Shinshu Hospitality Prize and represented the Nagano Prefectural Inbound NPO NINJA Project. He began working on guided cycling/town walking tours in May 2016, and also created the Ryokans of Nagano Podcast.</p>
